The <u>Syndicate Network</u> (SN) is a 'living network of scholarship in the Humanities' which runs symposia on new books, principally in the fields of philosophy, theology and comparative literature. Their symposia last 4 to 5 weeks. Each week consists of a panellist's take on a given book and a response by the author. During that week, audiences can follow the takes and responses and post comments. It works like a seminar, but with more time and flexibility for reflection.
