Hallett’s introduction approaches the “parenting style” of the second century BCE Roman aristocratic matron Cornelia, remembered as exemplary daughter and mother of storied political leaders, through a close reading of two letters attributed to her which voice unhappiness with the political—and familial—agenda of her younger son Gaius Gracchus.
