Her essay on Fulvia, a very different, but also politically prominent, aristocratic matron of the first century BCE, connects the punishment of Iullus Antonius, Fulvia’s youngest son by Mark Antony, for adultery with the emperor Augustus’ daughter Julia with the ill-will Augustus harbored toward Fulvia herself, an early and unforgettable political foe.
